The LORD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. (*Genesis 6:5 ESV*)

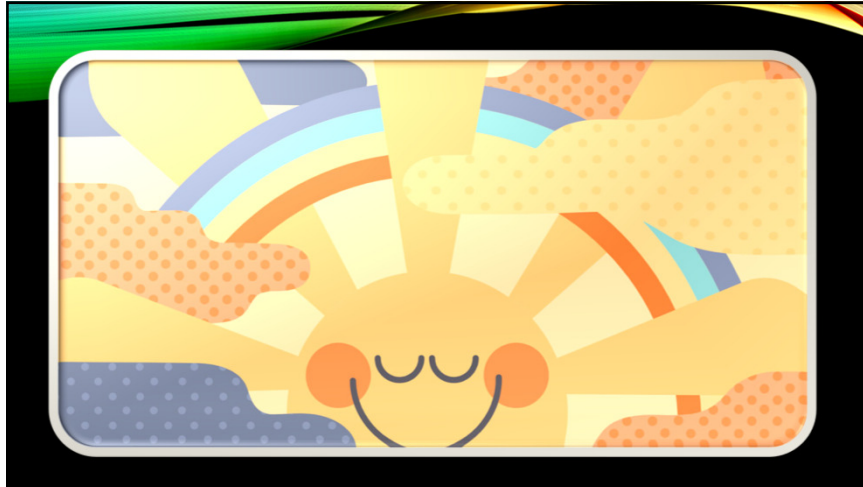
A third of mankind was killed by these three plagues... The rest of mankind did not repent (*Revelation 9:18, 20 NASB*)

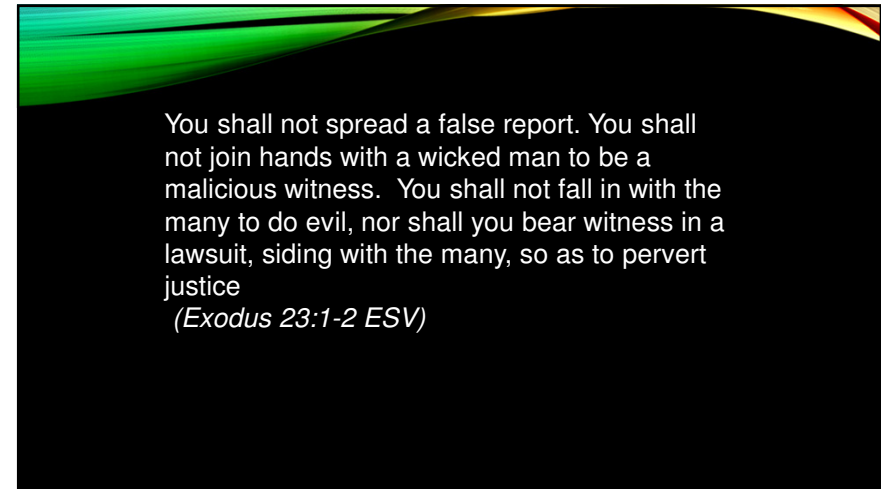

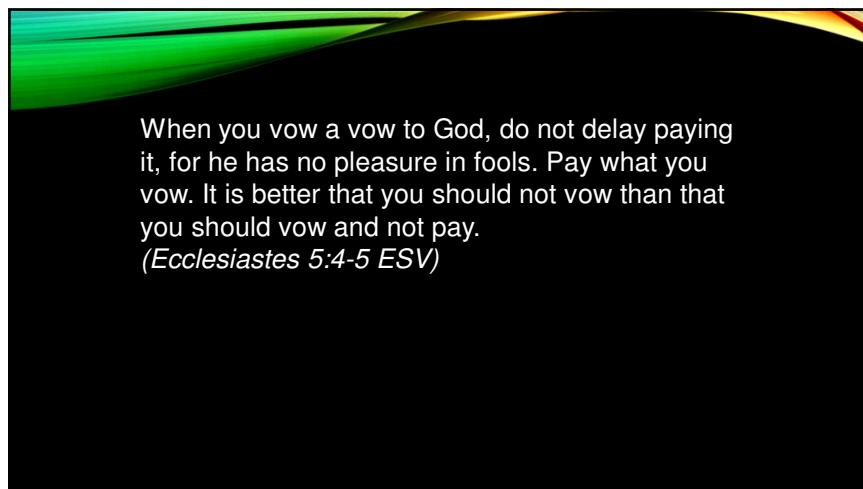

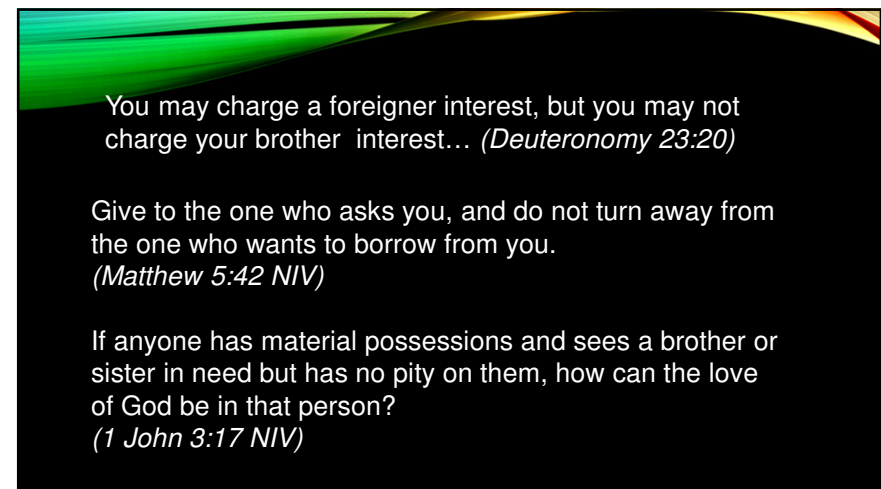
