


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Chiasmus analysis by Robert Alden

PSALM 37

- 1-8 A Exhortation to righteous to ignore wicked and to trust God.
- 9 B Wait and inherit the land.
- 10-15 C Righteous inherit but LORD destroys the plotting wicked.
- 16 D The poor are blessed though poor.
- 17 E Lord upholds righteous.
- 18a F Lord guides righteous.
- 18b G Righteous inherit.
- 19 H Righteous get.
- 20a I Wicked perish.
- 20b J Wicked like a sacrifice.
- 20c J' Wicked like a sacrifice.
- 21a I' Wicked give not.
- 21b H Righteous give.
- 22 G Blessed inherit.
- 23 F Lord guides righteous.
- 24 E Lord upholds.
- 25-26 D The blessed may be poor but not forsaken.
- 27-33 C Lord loves the righteous who will live and inherit but the plotting wicked will die.
- 34 B Wait and inherit the land.
- 35-40 A God destroys the wicked but saves the righteous.

Psalm 37:1-8: twelve imperative verbs:

1. “Do not fret”
“because of evildoers” vs 1
“because of him who prospers” vs 7
“it leads only to evildoing” vs 8
Fret = lit. “heat” or “burn”
Don’t fume; don’t get heated because of evil.

Psalm 37:1-8: twelve imperative verbs:

Four negatives:

1. “Do not fret” vs 1, 7, 8
2. “Be not envious” vs 1
3. “Cease from anger” vs 8
4. “Forsake wrath” vs 8

Eight positives:

1. “Trust in the Lord” vs 3, 5
2. “Do good” vs 3
3. “Dwell in the land” vs 3
4. “Cultivate faithfulness” vs 3

Psalm 37:1-8: twelve imperative verbs:

Eight positives:

5. “Delight yourself in the Lord” vs 4
6. “Commit your way to the Lord” vs 5

“Commit”
= to roll onto

“...humble yourselves **under the mighty hand of God**...casting all your anxiety **on Him**, because He cares for you.” I Pet 5:6-7

The “under-over principle”

Psalm 37:1-8: twelve imperative verbs:

Eight positives:

5. “Delight yourself in the Lord” vs 4
6. “Commit your way to the Lord” vs 5
7. “Rest in the Lord” vs 7
8. “Wait patiently for the Lord” vs 7

Three principles in Psalm 37

1. Look ahead: take the long view; consider their end; vs 2, 9, 10
2. Look up: focus on the Lord and what He will do for you; vs 4-6
3. Be constructive: do good, dwell in the land, be faithful; vs 3

Psalm 73: Why did Asaph envy the wicked?

1. They don't seem to suffer. vs 3-5
2. They seem to get away with disregarding God and His law. vs 6-7
3. They influence others with their speech and prosperity. vs 8-10

Psalm 73: Asaph had come to the wrong conclusion:

I Vs. 12: the wicked are always at ease "always?"

Vs. 13: it's been vain (useless) to live a godly life false!

Vs. 14: I've suffered "all day long...every morning" an exaggeration!

The turning point for Asaph (Ps 73:17):

"Until I came into the sanctuary of God..."

→ brought him to his spiritual senses

I "...Then I perceived their end."

→ put their "prosperity" into perspective

"O God, You have taught me from my youth, and ***I still declare Your wondrous deeds.*** And even when I am old and gray, O God, do not forsake me, ***until I declare Your strength to this generation,*** Your power to all who are to come."

"We will not conceal them from their children, but ***tell to the generation to come the praises of the LORD*** and His wondrous works that He has done....He commanded our fathers that they should ***teach them to their children, that the generation to come might know,*** even the children yet to be born, ***that they may arise and tell them to their children,*** that they should put their confidence in God and not forget the words of God, but keep His commandments." Psalm 78:4-7

Ps 42:1-3

As the deer pants for the water brooks, so my soul pants for You, O God.

Memory Passage: Psalm 42:

Ps 42:4-6

These things I remember and I pour out my soul within me. For I used to go along with the throng and lead them in procession to the house of God, with the voice of joy and thanksgiving, a multitude keeping festival.

Why are you in despair, O my soul? And why have you become disturbed within me? Hope in God, for I shall again praise Him for the help of His presence.

O my God, my soul is in despair within me; therefore I remember You from the land of the Jordan and the peaks of Hermon, from Mount Mizar.
