

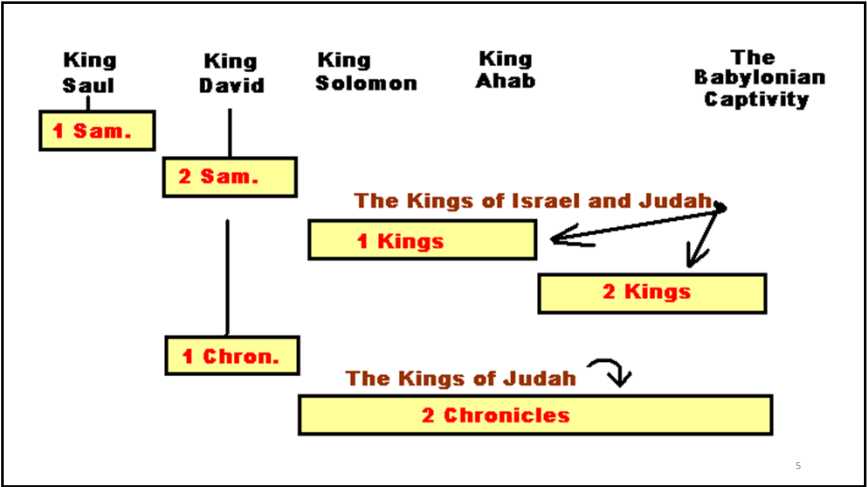

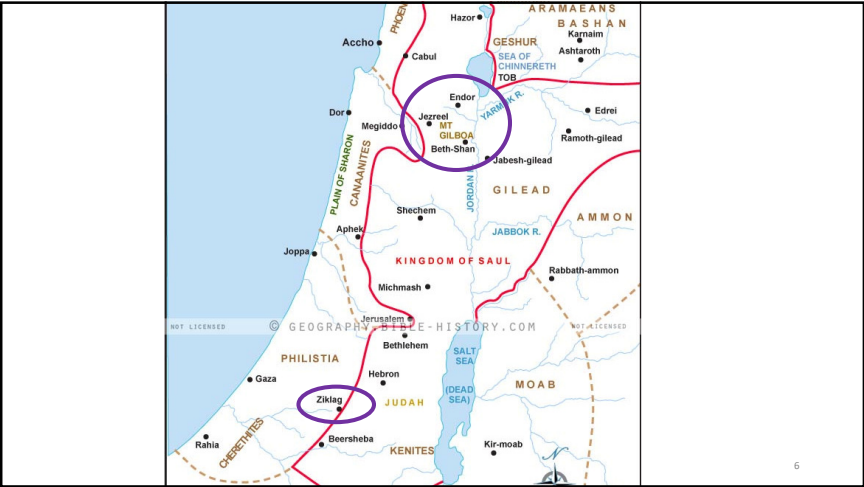

1. The differences between David & Saul:
 - a. Saul bore a grudge.
David wouldn't touch the Lord's anointed.
 - b. Saul inquired of a medium.
David inquired of the Lord.
 - c. Reactions to stressful situations:
Saul reacted rashly.
David was careful, waiting on the Lord.

 3. David & Jonathan: an example of true friendship.
