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Priority of wisdom for a stable family life:

- 1. Wisdom in *our choice of a spouse*:
 - God intended marriage for our good.

"Then the LORD God said, 'It is not good for the man to be alone; I will make him a helper suitable for him.'" Gen 2:18

Priority of wisdom for a stable family life:

• What Jesus said about marriage:

"...Have you not read that *He who created them* from the beginning made them male and female, and said, 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh?'...What therefore God has joined together, let no man separate."

Mt 19:4-6

Eph 5:23-25

"For the husband is the head of the wife, as Christ also is the head of the church....as the church is subject to Christ, so also the wives ought to be to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her."

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Eph 5:31-32

"For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and shall be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.' This mystery is great; but *I am speaking with* reference to Christ and the church." Prov 18:22 "He who *finds a wife finds a good thing and obtains favor* from the LORD."

Prov 19:14 "House and wealth are an inheritance from fathers, but *a prudent* [skillful, wise] wife is from the LORD."

I Pet 3:1-2 "...you wives, be submissive to your own husbands so that even if any of them are disobedient to the word, they may be won without a word by the behavior of their wives, as they observe your chaste [pure, innocent] and respectful behavior."

Paul's instructions in I Cor. 7:10-16



ch 1-4: "the fear of the Lord is the be ning of knowledge"

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Prov 19:23 "The fear of the LORD leads to life, so that one may sleep satisfied, untouched by evil."

As a husband and wife grow closer to the Lord, they grow closer to each other.

17:1 "Better is a dry morsel and qu. ess with it than a house full of feasting with e."

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Eph 4:28 "He who steals must steal no longer; but rather he must labor, performing with his own hands what is good, so that he will have something to share with one who has need."

13:16 "And do not neglect doing good an haring, for with such sacrifices God is, 13sed."

Heb 13:5 "Make sure that your character is free from the love of money, *being* content with what you have; for *He* Himself has said, 'I will never desert 'I, nor will I ever forsake you.'"

Deut 6:6-7 "These words, which I am commanding you today, shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your sons and shall talk of them when you sit in ur house and when you walk by the and when you lie down and when you ise up."

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Proverbs for women: she is NO doormat!

- She uses wisdom to build up her house; 14:1
- She is **trustworthy**, looking out for the good of her husband and family; 31:10-16
- She is socially-conscious, helping the poor and needy; 31:20
- She prepares ahead of time; is a "forward-thinker;" 31:21
- She is skilled in fashion design; 31:22
- She is an entrepreneurial business woman; 31:24
- She is known for being dignified, confident, wise, kind, and diligent. 31:25-27
- She has earned the praise that she receives; 31:28-29

The "other woman" in Proverbs:

- She is **contentious**, **vexing**, **and argumentative**; 19:13; 21:9,19
- She is uncontrolled and uncontrollable; 27:15-16
- She brings shame to her family; 12:4
- She is **boisterous**, **rebellious**, and always "gadding about" **getting in other people's business**; 7:11
- Her lack of discretion makes even a beautiful woman unattractive; 11:22

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Priority of wisdom for a stable family life:

- 1. Wisdom in our choice of a spouse.
- Wisdom in goals together as a family.
- 3. Wisdom in disciplining our children.

"The rod" = symbol of authority

- "The Rod": Rev 2:27; 12:5; 19:15" = scepter, a symbol of His authority.
- Ps 89:30-33 The Lord speaking to David: balance of punishment and love.
- Heb 12:5-11 –the Lord disciplines those who belong to Him; proves His love.
- Prov 13:24 "He who withholds his rod hates his son, but he who loves him disciplines him diligently."

parallelism: "the rod" = "discipline"; relationship between love and discipline

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"The rod" = symbol of authority

- Prov 26:3-4 "A whip for a horse, a bridle for a donkey, and a rod for the back of fools. Don't answer a fool according to his folly, or you will be like him."
- Prov 23:13-14 "Do not hold back discipline from the child, although you strike him with the rod, he will **not die**. You shall strike him with the rod and **rescue his soul from Sheol**." → **parallelism**: **discipline = keeps from death** (physical or spiritual).
- Prov 29:15 "The rod and reproof give wisdom, but a child who gets his own way brings shame to his mother."

[lit.: a child left to himself = neglect of discipline]

Consequences of discipline:

Negative (failing to discipline):

- A foolish son is destruction to his father (19:13), humiliates his father (28:7), grief to his father and bitterness to his mother (17:25; 10:1)
- The father of a fool has **sorrow** (17:21) and no joy (Ps 14:1)

Positive (using appropriate discipline):

- A wise son makes his father happy (15:20)
- The children of a virtuous woman bless her (31:28)
- A righteous man who walks in integrity has sons who are blessed (20:7)
- Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it (22:6)

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
