- It's a beautiful day in the neighborhood, a beautiful day for a neighbor, won't you be mine, could you be mine. 



Lev. 19:18

“...Love thy “REA” as thyself.”

STRONGS 7453: REA (ray-ah)—neighbor, friend, companion, associate, acquaintance, a fellow human being.

PROV. 3:28—“Do not say to your “Neighbor” go and come back tomorrow and I will give it, when you have it today.”

PROV. 14:21—“He who despises his “Neighbor” sins, but happy is he who is gracious to the poor.”

The 2 Greatest Commands

- **Deut. 6:5**—“You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.”
- **Lev. 19:18**—“...you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the LORD.”

Who IS My Neighbor?

- A **neighbor** can be anyone we come in contact with who has a need that we can meet.
- We're to love our **neighbor** by meeting their need without prejudice or partiality, regardless of background, religion, race, or political affiliation.

AGAPE

VERB: AGAPAO—TO LOVE

Generally—a love that is seated in the will rather than the feelings.

It's love that chooses deliberately to set its affection on some object or person.

Most often it's used as the “highest” form of love for the Christian and the type of love that is most typical of God's nature.

Love of Neighbor

- **Prov. 25:21**—“If your enemy is hungry, give him food to eat; if he is thirsty, give him water to drink.”
- **Prov. 16:7**—“When a man’s ways please the Lord, he makes even his enemies to be at peace with him.”
- **Prov. 14:21**—“He who despises his neighbor sins...”

- **PROV. 3:28**—“Do not say to your neighbor ‘come back tomorrow and I’ll give it to you’ when you already have it with you.”
- **1 JOHN. 4:20**—“Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen.”

- **Prov. 18:24b**—“...but there is a man who sticks closer than a brother.
