Biblical concept of maturity = completeness, having integrity, being upright, whole, above reproach, blameless; sometimes translated “perfect” but does not carry the idea of being sinless.

Maturity is the ability to apply the lessons learned to daily life; specifically, the ability to relate God’s truth to daily life.

“For though **by this time you ought to be teachers**, you have need again for someone to teach you the elementary principles of the oracles of God, and you have come to need milk and not solid food. For everyone who partakes only of milk is **not accustomed to the word of righteousness**, for he is an infant. But **solid food is for the mature**, who because of practice **have their senses trained to discern good and evil**. Therefore ... **let us press on to maturity....**”

Heb 5:12-14; 6:1

Essentials to growth and maturity (Heb 5:12-14):

1. Time (Heb 5:12): “by this time...”
2. Growth in the knowledge of God’s Word (Heb 5:13): “accustomed to the word of righteousness”
3. Experience in using God’s Word to discern right from wrong (Heb 5:14): “practice...trained”

Prov. 1:6 “the words of the wise **and their riddles**”

Ps 25:14 “**The secret of the LORD** is for those who fear Him, and He will make them know His covenant.”

I Cor 1:18 “For the word of the cross is **foolishness to those who are perishing**, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.”

Prov. 1:7 “The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge...” (also 9:10 & 15:33)

**Fear of the LORD** = *an attitude* of reverence, awe, and carefulness toward God and submission to Him **that result in obedience to God** and hatred of evil.

Ps 111:10 “The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; a good understanding have all **those who do His commandments**; His praise endures forever.”

Prov. 1:7 “The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge...” (also 9:10 & 15:33)


Eccl 12:13-14 “The conclusion, when all has been heard, is **fear God and keep His commandments**, because this applies to every person. **For God will bring every act to judgment**, everything which is hidden, whether it is good or evil.”

Charles Bridges (1846):

The fear of the Lord “is **that affectionate reverence** by which the child of God bends himself humbly and carefully to his Father’s law. His wrath is so bitter, and His love is so sweet; that hence springs **an earnest desire to please Him, and...a holy watchfulness and fear that he might not sin against Him.**”

### What was Paul's goal?

***"...whatever things were gain to me, those things I have counted as loss for the sake of Christ....I count all things to be loss in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord....that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings ...."*** Phil 3:7-10

### How do we continue to grow?

- I Pet 2:2 = by cultivating a desire for the word the way a baby desires milk.
- II Tim 3:15-17 = by continuing in the scriptures and building on what you have learned with new learning.

### Prov 2:1-4 notice the commands:

***"... receive my words...treasure my commandments .... make your ear attentive ... incline your heart ... cry for discernment ... lift your voice for understanding ... seek her as silver...search for her as hidden treasures; Then you will discern the fear of the LORD and discover the knowledge of God."***

Prov. 2:10 "For wisdom will **enter your heart....**"

Prov. 2:7 the LORD..."**stores up sound wisdom**  
for the upright...."

Two responses to the Word (James 1:21-25):

1. Close my ears, justify myself; remain unchanged = self-deceived! (James 1:22b-24)
2. Receive the word, hear, and respond by making necessary changes. (James 1:21-22, 25)

6 Essentials for Christian Maturity:

1. Keep strong and straight. Heb 12:12-13
2. Pursue harmony and holiness. Heb 12:14
3. Grow in grace, not bitterness. Heb 12:15
4. Reject immorality and Godlessness. Heb 12:15-17
5. Listen to God. Heb 12:25-26
6. Worship God with awe. Heb 12:28-29

***“Despondency is one of the great avenues of attack from the Evil One.*** Our discouragement is his delight, and he can use it to great effect, even for those involved in ministry....this is a call to step forward in the ‘strength that God supplies’ (I Pet 4:11)....Those who seek to follow Christ must be prepared to declare, ***‘I absolutely refuse to gratify the devil by staying downhearted.’*** He would love nothing more than to see our arms enfeebled, our knees buckling, and our paths veering off the course of obedience.”

2. Am I willing to have my opinions changed? Prov 9:9; 12:15; Phil 3:15
3. How susceptible am I to false doctrine or teaching? Prov 13:6,14; 14:15; Eph 4:13-15
4. How have I progressed in my knowledge and understanding of God’s Word? Am I applying it to my life? Heb 5:12-14; Prov 30:5-6; Ps 19:7
