



Israel ~ Vine

- Isaiah 5:1-4: beloved had a vineyard...choicest vine...he expected it to produce good grapes, but it only produced worthless ones
- Jeremiah 2:21: ...like a choice vine of sound and reliable stock. How did you turn against me into a corrupt, wild vine?
- Psalm 80:8-10:...removed a vine from Egypt, cleared ground...took deep root and filled the land



Their heart is faithless (divided)

- Charge: Going through the motions of worshipping God, but making altars to false gods at the same time. (vv 1-2)
- Judgment: God will break down altars, destroy sacred pillars. King would be of no use. (vv 2-3)

Truth versus Lies

- Charge: They twisted justice by making false promises, false oaths, false agreements, and frivolous lawsuits. (vv 4)
- Judgment: Nation destroyed, idols they trusted carried away, political system and king ruined. (vv 5-8)

Moral Depravity

- Charge: Moral depraved as at Gibeah (v 9)
- Judgment: Chastisement for all to see, double guilt/sin/iniquity
- Two calves: Dan and Bethel, or
- Jeremiah 2:13: abandoned God, made cisterns that can't hold water

Trained Heifer

- Charge: They were fat cows: prosperous and self-indulgent. (v 11)
- Judgment: Harnessed by Assyria and put to work. (vv 11-14)

*“Sow with a view to righteousness,
Reap in accordance with kindness;
Break up your fallow ground,
For it is time to seek the Lord until
He comes to rain righteousness on
you.”*

Reap what you sow...

- You have plowed wickedness, you have reaped injustice, you have eaten the fruit of lies. (v 13)
- You have trusted in your numerous warriors, you'll be destroyed by war. (13-14)
- Sow contrary to God's will, reap a harvest of God's displeasure and judgment. (v 15)

Spiritual Farming

- What are you sowing?
- What are you reaping?
2 Cor. 9:6
- Do you have fallow ground?
- Do you need pest control?

His Past Love (v 1-4)

- **God's Love:** When Israel was a youth I loved him, and out of Egypt I called My son. (v 11:1)
- **Israel's Response:** The more they called them, the more they went from them; they kept sacrificing to the Baals, and burning incense to idols. (v 11:2)

His Past Love (v 3)



His present love (v 5-8)

- Israel's response: They refused to return to Him. (vv5-7)

- God's response: How can I give you up? How can I surrender you? How can I utterly destroy you? My heart is turned over within Me, all my compassions are kindled. I will not execute My fierce anger.... (v 8-9)

His future love

- Israel's response: They will walk after the Lord....trembling from the west...trembling like birds from Egypt...like doves from land of Assyria
- God's response: I will settle them in their houses.
