

What Jacob saw in Gen 28:11-14:

- a ladder to heaven with angels going up and down on it
- The LORD standing at the top of the ladder
- A promise that in Jacob's line all the earth will be blessed

What Jacob saw in a vision, Nathanael would see fulfilled:

- The "heavens opened" = the only way into heaven
- "Son of Man" = provides access to Heaven
- The blessing is to all the world, not just the Jewish nation

Their relationship has **changed**.

- Luke 2:49 "Did you not know that I had to be in *My Father's House*?"

KJV: "*must be about My Father's business*?"

- Luke 2:51 "And He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and *He continued in subjection to them....*"

Their relationship has **changed**.


Jesus' focus was doing what His Father had for Him to do. He was now on His Heavenly Father's timetable.

- "My hour has not yet come."

John 7:30; 8:20: "His hour had not yet come"

John 12:23; 13:1; 17:1: "the hour HAS come" or "His hour HAD come"

- “What **sign** do You show...” = what’s your authority?
- I Cor 1:22 “For indeed **Jews ask for a sign** and Greeks search for wisdom”
- John 2:19-21 **THE sign** = Jesus’ resurrection
- Mt 12:38-40 “...we want to see a sign from You.’ But He answered.... no sign will be given to it but **the sign of Jonah**....for just as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the sea monster, so will **the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.**”
- Jesus’ resurrection would be the ultimate proof that He is the Son of God!

Things we learn about Jesus:

- His names / titles
 - Lamb of God (1:36)
 - Rabbi, Teacher (1:38)
 - Messiah, Christ (1:41)
 - Son of God (1:49)
 - King of Israel (1:49)
 - Son of Man (1:51)
- His attributes of deity
 - Omniscience = knowing even the thoughts
 - Omnipotence = power over nature (composition of water and wine)

$$H_2O \rightarrow C_2H_6O$$
- His nature
 - Graciousness to disciples (1:39)
 - Approving of traditional marriage (2:1-11)
 - Kindness to a bridegroom (2:3-10)
- His authority
 - Zeal for His Father’s house (2:15-17)

Things we learn about the disciples:

- They were seeking God & willing to commit to Him (1:37-51)
- They passed on the good news to others (1:41-46)
- They knew the Scriptures
 - 1:41 “We have found the Messiah... Christ”
 - 1:46 “Nazareth?” knew where Messiah was to be born (Micah 5:2)
 - 1:49 “You are the Son of God; You are the King of Israel”
 - 2:17 “Zeal for Thy House will consume me.”
- They believed the Scripture (2:22)
