Paul's warning:

Acts 20:28-30 “Be on guard for yourselves and for all the flock....I know that after my departure *savage wolves will come* in among you, not sparing the flock; and from among your own selves men will arise, *speaking perverse things*, to draw away the disciples after them.”

I Timothy 4:1 “in later times”

II Timothy 3:1,5,13-14

“But realize this, that in the last days difficult times will come, for men will be lovers of self holding a form of godliness, although they have denied its power....But evil men and impostors will proceed from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived. *You, however, continue in the things you have learned....*”

I Timothy 4:1 “depart from the faith” =

“These are professing or nominal Christians who associate with those who truly believe the gospel, but defect after believing lies and deception, thus revealing their true nature as unconverted.”

Matthew 12:30 “He who is not with Me is against Me; and he who does not gather with Me scatters.”

The origin of all false teaching = Satan!

Why their teaching is wrong:

I Timothy 4:3-4: "...forbid marriage and advocate abstaining from foods which God has created to be gratefully shared....For everything created by God is good...."

We can ask ourselves:

- ✓ “Did God create it for our good?”
- ✓ “Are we able to gratefully share this with others?”
- ✓ “Is it sanctified by the Word of God and prayer?” = does it violate scripture?

I Timothy 4:1-3 The Character of False Teachers:

- Deceitful = they can fool you! v.1
- Hypocritical = will pretend to be spiritual, godly but apply a different standard for themselves. v.2
- Liars = will twist the truth to fit their own agenda. v.2
- Hardened, insensitive conscience = will blatantly ignore clear teaching of scripture and justify it. v.2
- Will exercise unbiblical control over others: forbidding to marry, giving food restrictions, etc. v.3

Titus 1:15 “To the pure, all things are pure; but *to those who are defiled and unbelieving, nothing is pure, but both their mind and their conscience are defiled.*”

Colossians 2:20-23 “If you have died with Christ to the elementary principles of the world, *why...do you submit yourself to decrees, such as ‘Do not handle, do not taste, do not touch!’...in accordance with the commandments and teachings of men?* These are matters which have...the appearance of wisdom in self-made religion and self-abasement and severe treatment of the body, but *are of no value against fleshly indulgence.*”

I Timothy 4:7-8 = Contrast of godly discipline and worldly discipline:

- Your purpose in discipline should be godliness = does it have eternal value?
- Bodily discipline is of little profit, but it DOES have some profit = bodily discipline has profit for this life: for a little while.
- “Godliness is profitable for all things...for the present life and also for the life to come!”
- *How much time do you spend on maintaining your physical body in comparison to how much time you spend on growing your spiritual life?*

I Timothy 4:13-16 Practical Instructions:

- V.13 Public reading of scripture: both OT scriptures and the apostles' letters (cp. I Pet 3:15-16)
- V.13 Exhortation = application of the truths of scripture
- V.13 Teaching = systematic instruction from God's Word
- V.14 Don't neglect your own spiritual life
- V.14 Don't forget Who called you

I Timothy 4:13-16 Practical Instructions:

- V.15 “Be absorbed in them”
