Psalm 44:1-8

"O God, we have heard with our ears, our fathers have told us, the work that Thou didst in their days, in the days of old. Thou with Thine own hand didst drive out the nations; then Thou didst plant them; Thou didst afflict the peoples, then Thou didst spread them abroad. For by their own sword they did not possess the land; and their own arm did not save them; but Thy right hand, and Thine arm, and the light of Thy presence, for Thou didst favor them. +Burnt grain still in clay jars



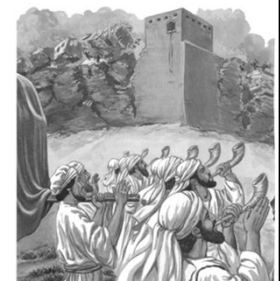

7—whole, complete
7 trumpets, 7 priests, 7 days
Rev. 5:6 The Lamb: 7 horns, 7 eyes, 7 Spirits
Rev.—7 seals of judgement, 7 trumpets, 7 bowls, 7 churches,
7 stars, 7 lampstands, 7 years of tribulation.
Gen.—7 days of the creation story

Josh. 6:10 Silence—Rev. 8:1 Silence ½ hour at the breaking of the 7th seal. Ps. 46:10 "Be still and know that I am God."
Ex. 14:14 "The Lord will fight for you while you keep silent."

Ark of the Covenant—God's presence, power, and glory
Many ask, "where is it now?" Rev. 11:19 "in the temple of God." We will see it!

Joshua 6:17 “And the city shall be under the ban” Hebrew “herem” devoted to destruction, excommunication, shunning, given over to the Lord. It can refer to people, places, or things.

The Canaanite culture & people were devoted to God’s destruction.

Why? Their iniquity was full. They were ready for God’s judgment.

Lev. 18:3 “you shall not do what is done in the land of Canaan where I am bringing you”

vs.4 “you are to perform My judgements.”

Incest (lewdness)

Polygamy

Adultery (defiled)

Child sacrifice to Molech (Ammonite deity)

Idolatry

Profanity

Homosexuality (abomination)

Beastiality (perversion)

vs.24 “Do not defile yourselves by any of these things; for by all these the nations which I am casting out before you have become defiled.”

Lev. 20:23 “You shall not follow the customs of the nation which I shall drive out before you; for they did all these things, and therefore I have abhorred them.”

Josh.6:21 “So they utterly destroyed everything in the city...”

Josh 6:25 “However, Rahab the harlot and her father’s household and all she had, Joshua spared.”

A beautiful, valuable red thread of redemption weaves through the Bible from Genesis to Revelation—the Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ—purchasing our salvation.

Gen 3:15 “He would be bruised”

Isa 53:5 “He was pierced, crushed”

Matt 27:35 “They crucified Him”

Eph 1:7 “redemption through His blood”

Rev 5:9 “Thou wast slain”

Rev 19:13 “Robe dipped in blood”

Jericho was burned with fire, but Rahab found mercy.

Heb 11:30 “By FAITH the walls of Jericho fell down, after they had been encircled for seven days.”

God’s battle plan for Jericho was a few symbolic acts to show Israel and the Canaanites how powerful He is.

Militarily, the 7 days of marching demanded nothing. Psychologically it demanded courage. The scheme was embarrassing to Israel and utterly preposterous to the Jerichonians. This isn’t the way cities are conquered! Faith looks foolish to the world.

Josh 6 records no complaining or doubt. They faithfully marched.

God delights in slaying men’s pride. He slew the pride of Jericho by making the walls collapse in the most foolish way. Israel’s pride was demolished knowing they could take no credit for the victory. All God wanted was faith. And they gave it.

4 types of faith:

Receives (empty-handed for salvation)

Reckons (counts on God to undertake)

Risks (battle of Jericho)

Rests (a life lived in God’s arms)
